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#### SCOPE OF CONFERENCE

The 12th International Conference on Liquid and Amorphous Metals (LAM12) will be held at Metz University in France, July 11-17 2004. The conference aims to provide the community of scientists who are interested in liquid and amorphous metals with an up to date survey of progress in the field. The first conference was held as LM-1 in 1966 at Brookhaven for the basic understanding of liquid metals. Succeeding LM conferences were held in Tokyo (1972) and Bristol (1976). The conference was renewed in Grenoble (1980) as a LAM conference including amorphous metals and continued in Los Angeles (1983), Garmisch-Partenkirchen (1986), Kyoto (1989), Vienna (1992), Chicago (1995), Dortmund (1998) and Yokohama (2001). The conference is devoted to liquid and amorphous metals. However, traditionally communications on some non-metallic systems such as semi conductors, molten salts, non-metals in metals, etc. will be accepted.

#### CONFERENCE LOCATION

The conference will be held at the Saulcy Campus of Metz University which is ten minutes on foot from the town center. Metz is situated near the frontier with Germany, Luxembourg and Belgium in the north-eastern part of France - 60 km from Nancy (to the south), 60 km from Saarbrücken (Germany to the north east), 60 km from Luxembourg (Luxembourg country to the north), 160 km from Strasbourg (to the east), 160 km from Liège (Belgium to the north west) and 300 km from Paris (to the west).

Metz is a three thousand years old historical city with 250 000 inhabitants. It is located in the "Région Lorraine", at the crossing between Champagne, Bourgogne and Alsace.
